



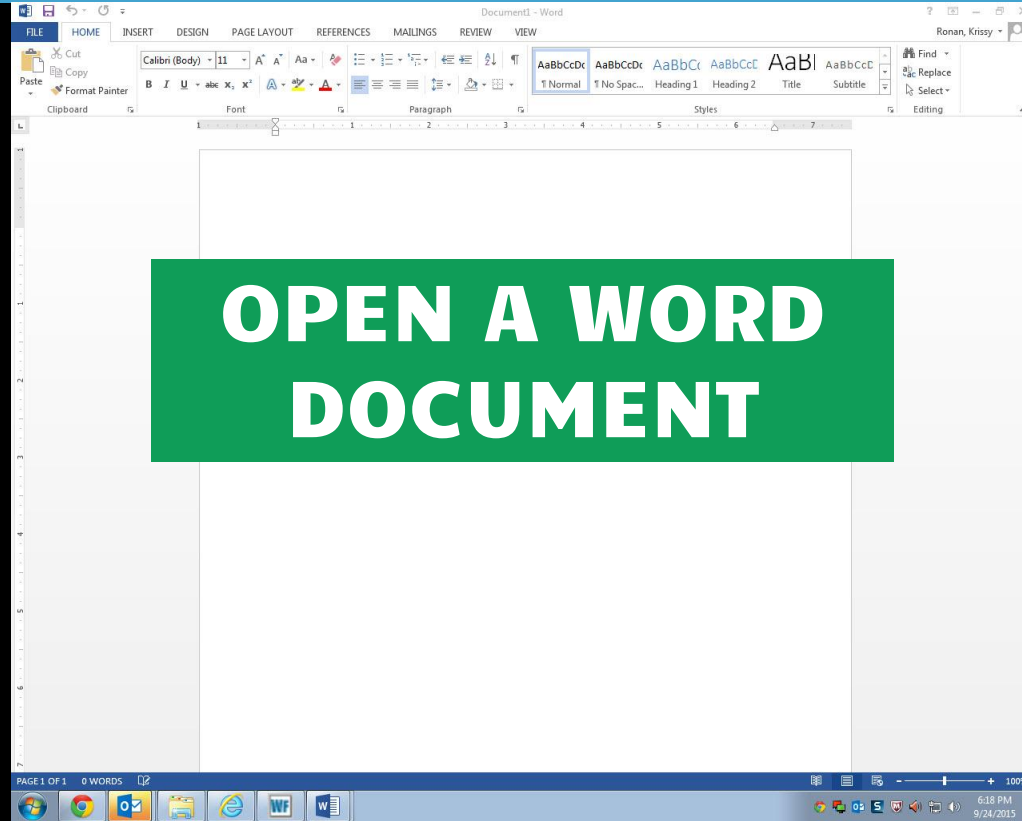

- 4. Version or edition used (if given).**
- 5. Publisher or Sponsor of the Site,**
- 6. Day Month Year of publication or n.d. if no date.**
- 7. Page or n.pag. if pagination is not used.**
- 8. Medium of Publication.**
- 9. Day Month Year you visited site.**
