



1821, Guatemala's history has been marked by a series of dictatorships alternating with periods of representative government. From 1960 to 1996, the country was plagued by a brutal civil war between leftist rebels, many of whom were Maya, and government forces, which were backed by the United States.

Ultimately, more than 200,000 people were killed or disappeared. In late 1994, a long-awaited United Nations (UN) human rights commission began operations to monitor rights abuses in Guatemala, which has one of the worst histories of abuses in Latin America. The civil war officially ended on December 29, 1996, when the comprehensive Guatemalan Peace Agreement was signed, and the country embarked on the arduous tasks of deconstructing the military, integrating former rebels into society, and rebuilding the country. A key army general in the war, Otto Pérez Molina, was sworn in as president in January 2012, after campaigning on promises of reducing the murder rate in a country beseiged by gangs, organized crime, and drug traffickers. Pérez represented the military at peace talks that ended the 36-year-old civil war in 1996 and although the military has been accused of numerous atrocities during the war, Pérez has denied participating in wrongdoing. In September 2015, Pérez resigned, amid allegations that he accepted up to \$800,000 in bribes. The former president is under investigation in a sweeping corruption scandal involving taxes and duties on goods brought into the

country, known as customs fees. Earlier, the scandal forced the resignation


of Pérez' vice president, Roxana Baldeti. In October 2015 elections, Jimmy Morales, a popular comedian with no political experience who grew up poor, won the presidency by a wide margin. Morales, who revealed little of


his policy intentions but campaigned on a promise to end corruption and the elite's control of government, won 67.4% of the vote. His opponent,

former first lady Sandra Torres, won 36.2%.
