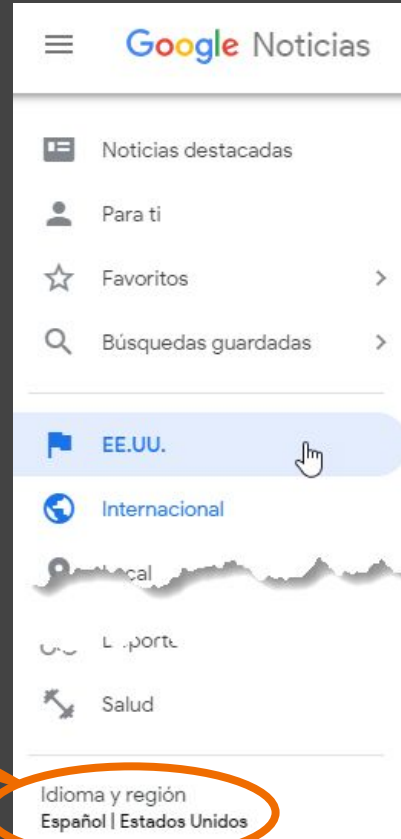

## Life in Guatemala

Everyday life in Guatemala can be a challenge. Poverty is a major problem, and there is a wide gap between the rich and poor. Many Guatemalans struggle to provide food, shelter, and clothing for their families.

About half of the population lives in urban areas. Most urban families live in modest, square homes made of cinderblock and cement with flat roofs. Many poor residents live in sprawling slums in shelters made from salvaged materials. Rural families live in simple homes made from wood, cinderblock, or adobe. Often three generations of family members live together. When they do not share a house, relatives usually live nearby.

Education is valued as a key to a better life. However, many poor families cannot afford uniforms, books, or supplies. Poor students often drop out early to work and support their families.

The flag of the Republic of Guatemala is three equal vertical bands of light blue (hoist side), white, and light blue with the coat of arms centered in the white band; the coat of arms includes a green and red quetzal (the national bird) and a scroll bearing the inscription LIBERTAD 15 DE SEPTIEMBRE DE 1821 (the original date of independence from Spain) all superimposed on a pair of crossed rifles and a pair of crossed swords and framed by a wreath.
